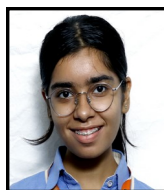

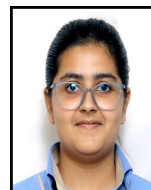

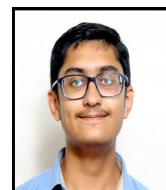

Safe and Unsafe Touch

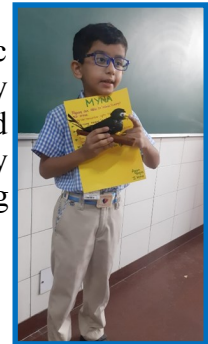

Socio-emotional Learning Sessions on the theme of 'Accepting Myself and Respecting Differences' were conducted with the students of Class IV .

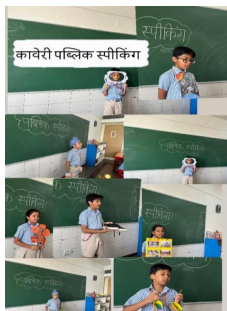

Using a combination of social stories and songs, the school counsellor helped the students explore the fleeting nature and range of emotions they experience during the day. Throughout the sessions, they participated avidly. In addition, they discovered that there are numerous safe ways to communicate and express sentiments without endangering oneself or others.

The Srijan School hosted two CBP workshops for select teachers. The workshops were organised with 60 teachers participating in each workshop.

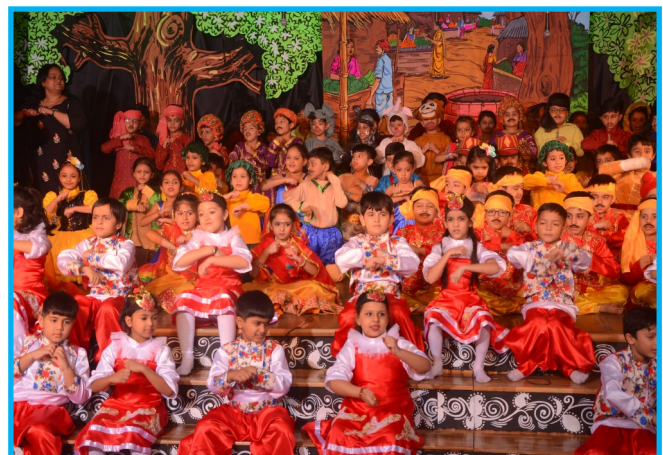

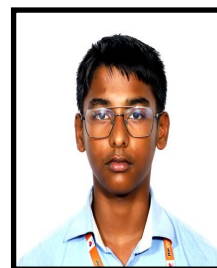

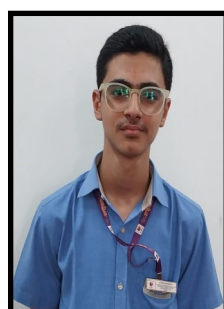
